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TEACHER'S HANDOUT

PRZYGOTOWANIE:

Dzielimy uczniów na grupy, pary lub ustalamy pracę indywidualną.

Organizujemy przestrzeń w klasie – ułożenie ze stolików 6 „wysp – stacji” z kilkoma stanowiskami pracy.

Omówienie zasad pracy – zapoznanie uczniów z metodą stacji – zwracamy uwagę na dowolność w kolejności wykonywania zadań, szacunek dla materiałów – piszemy tylko na swoich kartach odpowiedzi, nie przeszkadzamy sobie nawzajem. Należy także zaznaczyć, aby przy jednej stacji nie było „tłoku” i prosić o płynną zmianę stanowisk pracy.

Każdy uczeń/zespół powinien mieć możliwość wyboru ćwiczeń oraz kolejności ich wykonywania. Każda osoba/grupa otrzymuje zbiorczą kartę odpowiedzi – na nią nanosi rozwiązania, które sprawdzi przy ostatniej stacji. Zależnie od ustaleń można (ale nie jest to konieczne) pozwolić na korzystanie z zasobów internetu (szczególnie podczas zadania muzycznego).

Po zakończeniu pracy na ostatniej stacji uczniowie sami sprawdzają wyniki swojej pracy, jeśli dysponujemy czasem, może nastąpić faza wspólnego omówienia zadań. Uczniowie mają tu szansę wyrażenia swojej opinii, która ze stacji najbardziej im się podobała lub nie – i dlaczego, które zadania były trudne/łatwe/niejasne, czy chętniej pracują sami, czy w parach/w grupie, czy potrzebowali pomocy (jakiej?). Można także nagrodzić grupy z największą liczbą trafnych odpowiedzi (ale musi być to uzgodnione z uczniami na początku zabawy).
